Shiloh Israel Children's Fund Addresses Needs of Children Victimized, Traumatized by Horrific Terrorist Attacks

David Rubin, Organization Founder and Author of New Book "God, Israel, & Shiloh" on U.S. Media Tour – Interviews Available

SHILOH, Israel – After he and his 3-year-old son survived a 2001 terrorist attack, David Rubin, author of the new book *God, Israel, & Shiloh: Returning to the Land* (www.GodIsraelShiloh.com), launched Shiloh Israel Children's Fund (www.ShilohIsraelChildren.org) to support therapeutic, educational, and recreational projects for children victimized by Islamic fundamentalist terrorist attacks.

With the help of friends of Israel in the United States and proceeds from his book, Rubin has worked with educational and community leaders to make a difference in the lives of hundreds of children and their families. On Nov. 10, Rubin will arrive in the U.S. to meet with media representatives and supporters to raise awareness of the ministry and to shine the light on increasing Islamic threats to the region and their growing impact on the region's children.

After Rubin and his son Ruby survived the vicious shooting attack in 2001, Rubin began receiving dozens of requests to share his compelling story. In response to the outpouring of support, Rubin launched Shiloh Israel Children's Fund to help ease the pain and fear experienced by young victims like his son. The organization has funded a number of programs for child victims of terror in the area, including playgrounds, Biblical parks and gardens, and summer programs. The organization also has provided direct aid to orphans and widows, and supported post-trauma treatment programs and hands-on therapeutic learning programs.

"Since the launch of Shiloh Israel Children's Fund, we've been able to help families rebuild their lives after suffering massive traumas and injuries," said Rubin. "Terrorism continues to plague Shiloh, so there's still much work to be done. We've had a tremendous amount of support, and we're prayerful that we'll be able to continue serving the needs of our community's children through treatment, innovative programming and financial aid."

To assist in the fundraising effort for the organization, Rubin, the former mayor of Shiloh, is donating proceeds from the sale of his book, *God, Israel, & Shiloh: Returning to the Land*, to the organization. The book chronicles Israel's road from exile to independence and delivers an insightful perspective on modern-day developments, including Islamic threats to the region, failed political plans for peace and the recent increase in support from the evangelical Christian community. In addition to the historic and political insights shared in the book, Rubin provides firsthand accounts of life from the front lines of the struggle for the land of Israel and the war on terrorism.

"In the book, I tell the story of the children of Israel who traveled from slavery in Egypt to glory in Shiloh and Jerusalem," said Rubin. "Just as those children were delivered, it's our hope that Shiloh Israel Children's Fund will help deliver the children in our community from the violence, death, destruction, and peril that they are currently facing as terrorist attacks continue to plague the region."

God, Israel, & Shiloh, released this month, includes interviews from families recently affected by increased terrorism in the area, including children wounded by terrorist gunfire. The book is currently available at www.Amazon.com and www.BarnesandNoble.com.

Rubin will appear on Cornerstone TeleVision (CTVN) in Pittsburgh on Nov. 13, and make additional appearances throughout the Southeast to promote his book and to generate awareness for his organization.
